



## How to Make Your own Rosettes

Rosettes are the badges worn by candidates to show what political party they belong to and what they believe in. Make a Rosette that represents your right and belief and stand as a candidate to defend that Human Right.

### You Will Need

- A copy of the rosette template sheet
- A safety pin
- Scissors
- Glue
- Coloured pens or pencils
- Sticky tape

### To Make the Rosette:

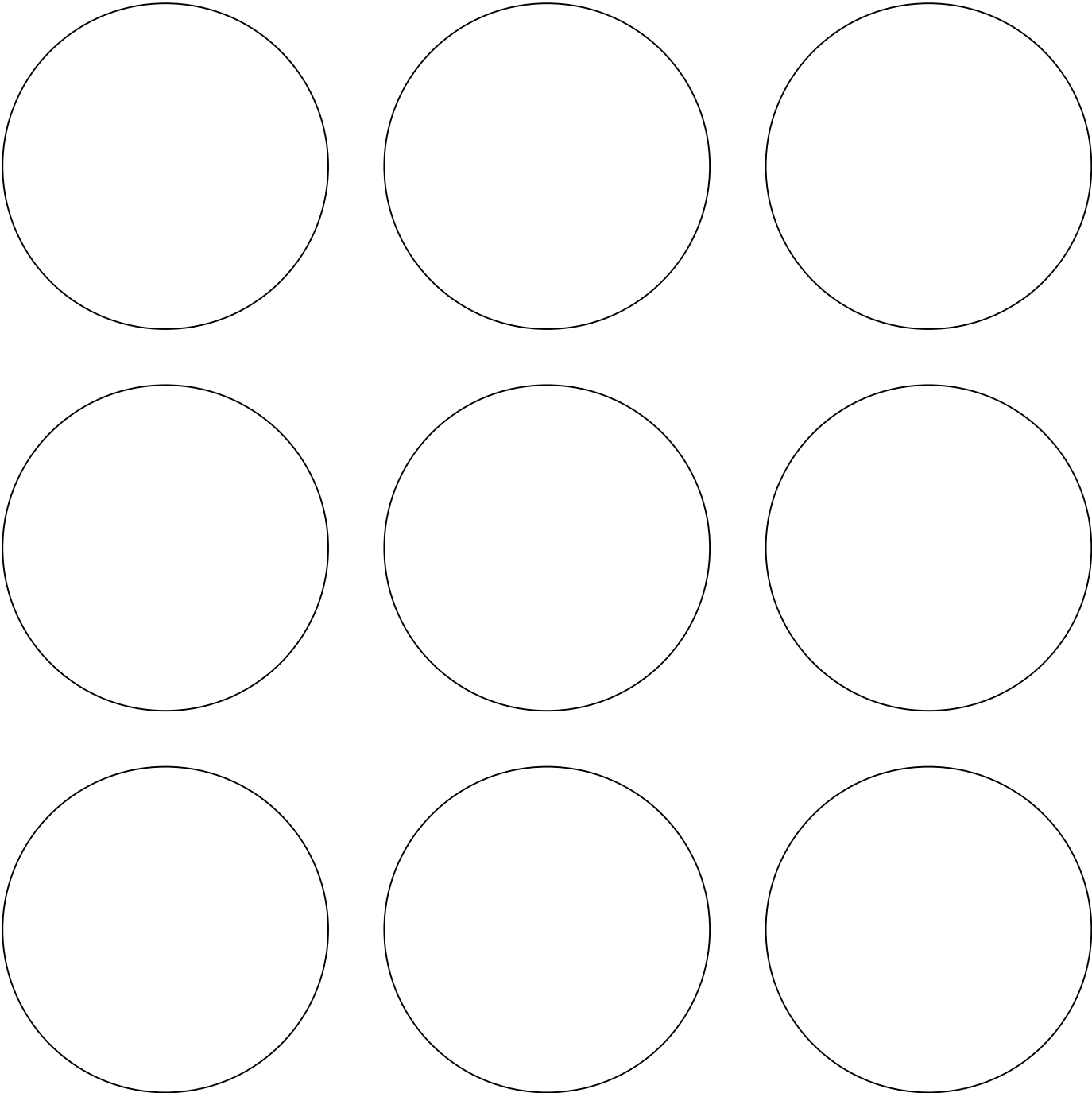
1. Design a logo in the small circle that represents your chosen Human Right.
2. Colour 12 of the small shapes in one colour and 12 of the small shapes in another colour that represents your party.
3. Colour the 2 long shapes in the colours chosen for your party
4. Cut out all the shapes.
5. Using the large circle, stick the small end of the small shapes in one colour, to look like a sunshine using the grey inner circle as a guide.
6. Attach the 2 long shapes so they hang down from the rosette.
7. Stick the 12 small shapes in the other colour over the 12 gaps in the sunbeams using the grey circle as the guide.
8. Cover the rough inside edges by sticking the smaller circle in the middle showing the logo of your chosen Human Right.
9. Attach the safety pin to the back of the Rosette with sticky tape.
10. It is now ready for you to wear and have a debate with your classmates or friends on the best Human Right.
